

### **MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD - OCTOBER 2023**

We have just a few more events planned before the end of the year and the start of a new one, a demo in October and the party in December.

We are also planning the holiday art supply collection for community kids in coordination with the Kiwanis holiday gift event...More details as that effort comes together.

### **SEPTEMBER PRESENTATION**

We were privileged to hear an excellent presentation from Zoé Arkfeld of *The ARTery* on considerations for selecting mats and frames for our work. As a beginner, I have often struggled with how to frame my work. Zoe touched briefly on



the importance of the framing package to protect art work from damage by light, bugs and moisture, among other things, using the mat to separate paintings from glass in the event moisture does get in and condense on the glass. She also did a quick review of options for glass, including regular glass, museum glass, Plexiglas (often required by galleries for large pieces) and new scratch resistant and non-glare Plexiglas. She showed a few techniques for attaching paintings to the mat or backing as well.

The best part though was a walkthrough of selecting a mat and frame color and style that really highlights the work. Some of the things we talked about were

picking up colors and textures in the painting, particularly of the focal point, the style and mood of the painting, the intent of the painter, and the lighting that it will have when hung. The frame also complements the mood, style and colors of the painting. It was fascinating to see how a different color mat gave the work a new look and "presence." Several samples on display showed how the matting really brought out the beauty of the work by creating a space for it to shine.



How often have I grabbed the best fitting frame in my stockpile to put my picture in, likely making it look exactly like - I just grabbed the nearest frame...oops! I thought later, it is rather like collecting a mish mash of furniture off the sidewalk to fill your college apartment, versus taking time to buy something coordinated and beautiful for your favorite room.

One last reminder, of course, was to be sure to leave room around the painting for the edge to be covered with any mat or frame, usually 1/8" to 1/4" on each edge and don't hide your signature on the edge where it will disappear behind the frame.

### **VOTE 2023**


